THEODORA ANAGOL

If you ever wander through Portobello on a Saturday, make a special effort to find Theodora Anagol's stall. She has been there for four years; you'll find her opposite Cambridge Gardens, where Acklam Road meets Portobello.

Theodora's signature pieces are asymmetrical cardigans and tweed jackets. The cardigans are made from woollen jumpers that have been pulled apart, dyed and resurrected, to create leftfield, chunky pieces that can be worn in a variety of ways, including upside down. 'My designs come from years of messing around with dyes, and pulling clothes apart and putting them back together again,' explains Theodora. She worked as a chef briefly, before studying fashion and textiles at Central St Martins. 'It is tough setting up on your own,' she says. 'But I never want to work for anyone else. My dream now is to open a shop on Westbourne Grove.'

Theodora's stall features new pieces every week, so get there early if you want the best choice. Going by the obvious talent and serious originality this 35-year-old is already displaying, you might just end up with your own piece of designer history. *Theodora Anagol, Portobello Market, London W11.
